Lego Club


Wednesday, August 3, 2:00pm-3:30pm Build whatever you want, take a picture, and display it in


JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW

Violet Westcott is happy her famous aunt is back. However, Violet has been conscripted for the war effort. She would rather stay home and snag a rich husband.Local Vicar's daughter Grace Carlisle is hoping get her Mother's wedding gown repaired before her marriage to her father's curate. One evening Grace, Cressida and Violet all attend the local sewing circle. After Cressida helps Grace repair her Mother's dress the sewing circle has the idea to ask for donations of wedding gowns from around the town and the whole country. The dresses will be loaned to brides who can't buy a white dress because of the rationing of material for the war effort. The three narrators of the book come from different backgrounds.

The book is based on real events. I've enjoyed all four of the author's novels.
