
2:30pm to 4:30pm to play some of the new board games we've added to our collection, or play one of your old favorites!

#### **JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW**

#### The Codebreaker's Secret by Sara Ackerman

Author Sara Ackerman's novels are all set during World War II in the South Pacific. The year is 1943 and Isabel Cooper has been assigned to Pearl Harbor to decipher top secret Japanese navel code. Isabel wants to do her part for the war effort as her brother Walt died December 7, 1941 during the sneak attack that day.

Also in the novel is Lu Freitas a young journalist who comes to Hawaii in 1965. She is covering the grand opening of the first destination hotel built by the wealthy Rockefeller in Hawaii. Lu meets a famous photographer who was Isabel's brother's best friend. When a well known singer disappears Lu and Matteo try to solve the mystery. Soon they expose a dangerous secret from Isabel's time as a codebreaker.
