


# EARLY RELEASE WEDNESDAY: DINOSAUR DAY

#### Funeral Train by Laurie Loewenstein

Vermillion, Oklahoma, December 1935. Sheriff Temple Jennings is on his way to the train station to pick up his wife Etha when the train she is on derails. After searching for a long time Jenning's deputy Ed locates Etha Jennings being loaded into an ambulance. She has a nasty wound to her thigh but will survive. Not so lucky are the fifteen fatalities. A railroad detective, Claude Steele, arrives to help the Sheriff investigate the derailment. They learn the train was sabotaged. The next day local blackmailer, Ruthie-Jo Mitchem, is discovered strangled near the railroad tracks. Are the two crimes connected?

I also enjoyed the first book in this series (*Death of a Rainmaker*). My parents moved from Oklahoma in 1935, the year this series is set in. This book shows how hard times can bring out the best and worst in people.
