
STORYTIMES

JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW

Surrender: 40 Songs, One Story by Bono

This is a biography/memoir by Paul Hewson, better known as Bono. Born in Dublin, Ireland in 1960, he lost his mother when he was 14. Bono of course witnessed the war for home rule known as the "Troubles." He always loved to sing. His father didn't really support the idea. This book is 500 pages long. It covers when he met his three other band members and his wife, Ali, when they 14 years old. The marriage and the band are still together for over 40 years. Bono is stubborn, religious and persistent. He and the band U-2 have raised millions for charities. All are passionate about fighting poverty and hunger worldwide. Bono says he learned from the U.S. civil rights movement you may have to work with people who are on the opposite side. I found this memoir thoughtfully written, funny and poignant.
