JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW

The House of Lincoln by Nancy Horan

This historical novel is an account of Abraham and Mary Lincoln's lives in Springfield, Illinois from the early 1850s through Lincoln's assassination. In 1849 nine-year-old Ana Ferreira's family emigrates from Portugal to Springfield. Ana becomes friends with Callie, a freed black girl whose family is involved with the underground railroad. When Ana is 14 she takes a job as a helper to a married lady with children. This woman is Mary Todd Lincoln. We see the Lincolns and 19th Century America from an interesting narrator.

This author's two other historical novels about Frank Lloyd Wright and Robert Louis Stevenson are very interesting also.
