
# **JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW**

## Sisters Under the Rising Sun by Heather Morris

The date is February 1942. In this novel based on fact, young mother Norah puts her 8-year-old daughter Sally on a ship to Australia. They live in Singapore and the Japanese army is invading. Within a few weeks Norah and her sister Ena decide they must leave Singapore also.

Nurse Nesta James is caring for allied troops when the city falls. Nurse James and the sisters board the merchant ship Vyner Brooke with hundreds of people. Two days later the Japanese sink the ship. The three women are captured and taken to a prisoner of war camp in Sumatra, Indonesia. Many of the POWs died of starvation and disease. The sisters Ena and Norah and the Australian nurses come together to survive the brutal conditions.

This novel is based on real people. The author tells us in the epilogue what became of the main characters. Sisters Under the Rising Sun is a story of friendship and bravery.
