Frozen River by Ariel Lawhon

The year is 1789. Maine in November. A man's body is found frozen into the ice of the Kennebec River. Martha Ballard, a midwife, is asked to examine the body for cause of death. Martha records every birth and death in her diary. A few months previously she documented the details of a rape. Martha determines the man in the river was murdered. One of her patients says the dead man, Joshua Burgess, and a local Judge, Joseph North, are the men who attacked her. The Judge vehemently denies this. He starts rumors around town that Martha's husband or son committed the murder. Characterization was excellent. The reader will like Martha Ballard. This will be my first best novel of 2024.
