# JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW

## The Hazelbourne Ladies Motorcycle and Flying Club by Helen Simonson

It's summer 1919. World War I has ended and the flu epidemic is over. Constance Haverhill has just lost her job as a bookkeeper for her brother's small estate. She's taken a position as a lady's companion for Mrs. Fog. They are staying at a seaside resort hotel in Hazelbourne, England. Constance meets Poppy Wirrall and her brother Harris. Poppy and other women delivered messages and supplies by motorcycles during the war. Now Poppy wants to start a taxi service. Her brother is depressed and in pain. He was a bomber pilot in the war. His plane crashed and he lost a leg. When Poppy locates a broken down Sopwith Camel bi-plane she buys it for her brother to refurbish. She's hoping to use the plane to offer flying lessons. When the men got home from the war, the women who replaced them were expected to go back to their traditional rolls. This is thoughtful historical fiction about a nation on the brink of change.
