We now have a **Nintendo Switch Lite** available for checkout. Loan period is 14 days and no holds or renewals are allowed.


JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW

The Woman in the Sable Coat by Elizabeth Brooks

In rural England the year is 1934. Two 14-year-old friends, Rose and Nina, are asked to show Canadian Joey Roussin to his army buddy Guy Nicholson's home, Hawthorn House. Nina, who has an adolescent crush on Guy, invites him and his pregnant wife Kate and Joey to dinner at her and her father Henry's home.

Eight years later it is 1942. Nina is 22 and in the Women's Auxiliary Air Force. She meets Guy again. A friend has told Nina that Guy is divorced from his wife. Actually Guy is not divorced. Kate, his former wife, and their son Pip still live at Hawthorn House. Guy and Nina begin a torrid affair. Henry, Nina's father, learns of this and disowns her. Guy's wife Kate and Henry become friends.

The book is told in alternating chapters by Kate and Nina. We learn that a murder happened at Hawthorn House many years before. I hadn't read anything by this author. The characterization is well done. The moody setting is interesting.
