JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW

The Booklover's Library by Madeline Martin

Emma Taylor is a young widow living in Nottingham, England with her seven-year-old daughter Olivia. The year is 1939 and there is a marriage bar law in effect. Once a woman had married she wasn't allowed to work outside the home. No one would hire them. Emma

needs a job to pay her rent and feed her daughter. She's already pawned the first edition books left by her father when he died.

One day Emma is sitting in café near Boots the Chemist, a pharmacy. Boots has a subscription library on their second floor. Emma overhears a woman resigning a job there. Emma applies for the library job. The manager hires Emma, if she agrees to pose as an unmarried woman. The next year, 1940, Germany starts bombing Britain. Emma is one of the many parents who are encouraged to evacuate their children to the countryside for their safety. Olivia, who wants to come home, runs away.

The setting of wartime Nottingham was realistic told through the eyes of Emma and her daughter.
