POKÉMON CLUB


Wednesday, April 30, 4:00pm

JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW

The Dressmakers of London by Julia Kelly

In London before World War II Isabella Shelton, known as Izzie, works with her mother in the family's dress shop. Her older sister Sylvia was 11 and Izzie seven when their father died. Their mother needed to work to support the family. Now the sisters are 21 and 25. Sylvia is married to a wealthy young doctor. Sylvia hasn't visited her mother and sister in years. Izzie deeply resents this. The young women's mother dies and she leaves the shop to both of them. When Izzie is conscripted for the war effort she must ask her sister to run the shop. Sylvia knows nothing about dressmaking but is great at organizing. She learns some patrons haven't paid their bills. The style of dresses are dated and they're losing business. Slowly, while corresponding, the sisters start to trust each other. Through letters Izzie and Sylvia forge a new beginning.
