

## **JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW**

#### Murder Ballads: Illustrated Lyrics & Lore by Katy Horan

When I was a little girl my brother, who was 12 years older than me, brought home record albums by folksinger Joan Baez. Some of the recordings included collections of songs known as Murder Ballads. These were traditional ballads from England and Scotland. Most of the songs were from the 17th and 18th centuries. These were named Child Ballads after the professor who found them, usually in the Appalachian mountains. A Murder Ballad tells of a killing, almost always the boyfriend or lover killing the girlfriend. When Scots and English settlers moved to America they were still singing these ballads. Some of the titles I remember are: The Cruel Mother; The Silkie; Matty Groves; The Death of Queen Jane; and Mary Hamilton. Enjoying history and songs that tell a story it's no surprise I

remember these ballads.
