JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW —

Ghosts of Hiroshima by Charles Pellegrino

This disturbing but important book recounts the first use of the atomic bomb. The date was August 6, 1945. On that day 29-year-old engineer Tsutomu Yamaguchi was in Hiroshima on business. Injured but still mobile he took the train home to Nagasaki, the site of the second atomic bombing! Detonation of the bombs caused light and colors never seen before or since. After detonation black rain fell for hours spreading radioactivity. The bomb blasts left dark shadows of people who were incinerated. Over 200,000 people died in the two cities. Military leaders in Tokyo choose to keep fighting even after the Hiroshima bomb. President Truman's objective was to save as many American soldiers lives as possible. The use of the bombs had profound effect on human events.
