

RCCL Vaccination Card Lamination FAQ

- **Q: Is there a fee for this service?**
A: No, it's completely free!
- **Q: When can I get my vaccination card laminated?**
A: *Monday-Thursday 10am-6pm* or if that doesn't work for your schedule, give us a call and we'll make arrangements for you to come in when it is convenient.
- **Q: Can you laminate my original vaccination card?**
A: Yes, but some have thermal stickers on them and they will turn black when laminated. So, we recommend you scratching any stickers with your nail to see if they turn black. If they turn black, they're thermal, so we'll want to make a copy of the original and laminate that instead. We are also happy to make a laminated copy of your original if you don't have thermal stickers, just let library staff know that's what you'd prefer.
- **Q: Will laminating my card damage it?**
A: Staff make every effort to ensure that your vaccination cards are not damaged in this process. However, we cannot guarantee that there will be no damage and staff are not responsible if damage does occur. If this is a concern for you, we recommend retaining the original and laminating a copy.
- **Q: Do I need to have a complete series of shots before I can laminate my card?**
A: Yes, you need to have completed all shots in your series before we laminate the card.
- **Q: How long does the process does take?**
A: 15 min or less! Feel free to browse for library materials while you wait, we'll take care of the rest.
- **Q: Can I drop off my card to be laminated and pick it up later?**
A: Unfortunately, no. Due to liability concerns, we need patrons to stay in the building with their cards. However, if there is an alternate time that works better for you, we can make an appointment at that time and laminate your card when it's more convenient.
