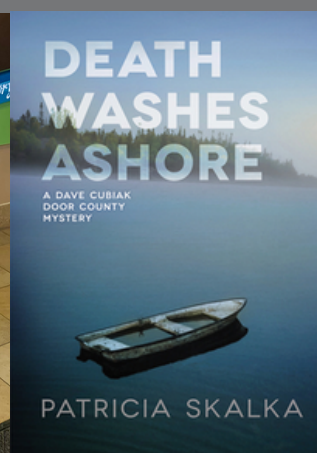
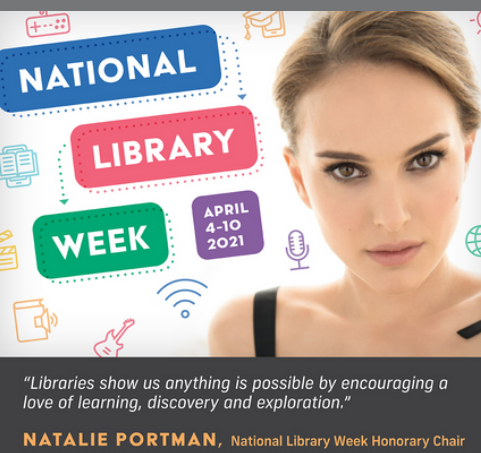

The Ruth Culver Community Library is currently open for browsing the collection, computer use and other basic services by appointment. Appointments are on the hour and can be made by calling 608-643-8318. In most cases, you will be able to come the same day and even name the hour you'd like to come. Evening appointments are especially easy to get.

**Drop-in visits are accepted as space allows;** just knock at the inside door. Please maintain social distancing and wear a mask while you are here, even if you are only briefly in the lobby. **We look forward to opening without appointments May 1!**

### Lobby Pickup

This service remains available to those that wish to utilize it. We will gather your items, bag and label them, and then place them on a table in the lobby for pick-up. No appointment needed; just call the library before you arrive. Curbside service is also available if you do not wish to enter the building or are unable to wear a mask.

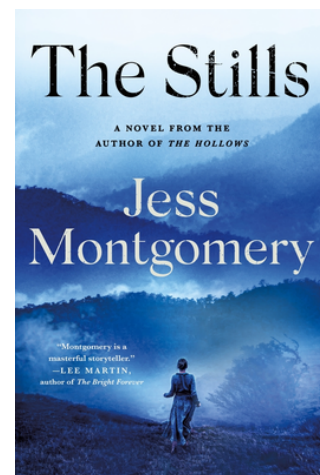
## JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW

*The Stills* by Jess Montgomery

It's Thanksgiving 1926 in Kinship, Ohio, a small town near the Appalachian mountains. Sheriff Lily Ross must investigate when a 12-year-old boy who has been hired to watch a moonshiner's still witnesses a man shoot an agent from the Bureau of Prohibition.

Also in the same town, Fiona Vogel returns to her Aunt's and Uncle's farm with bootlegger husband George. Luther Ross, Lily's brother-in-law, has turned up back in town with the Vogels. Before too long Luther's body is discovered.

This third book in the Kinship series combines historical fiction with mystery and a strong sense of time and place.
