JUNE'S BOOK REVIEW


Go Tell the Bees That I Am Gone by Diana Gabaldon

After seven years, the ninth book in the Outlander series finally came out November 23. The first title, *Outlander*, was released in June 1991. Not long after World War II Claire Randall, a nurse, is on a belated honeymoon with husband Frank in the Scottish highlands. As Claire is out walking alone she sees standing stones on a hill. When she puts her hand out to touch a stone she is transported back to the 1740s. There she meets Jamie Fraser who marries her to protect her.

Over the length of the series the couple fall deeply in love. When Claire becomes pregnant they make the decision to send her back to the 20th Century. The violent Jacobite Rebellion is coming soon and Claire knows the Scots suffer a great defeat.

After 20 years back in her own time period, and with daughter Brianna grown, Claire returns to the past and Jamie. The family end up in North Carolina. The year is 1179 and the American Revolution is upon them.

This is my favorite series and author. The books are touching, dramatic and moving.
