John Newbery Medal (most outstanding contribution to children's literature): *The Last Cuentista* by Donna Barba Higuera

Randolph Caldecott Medal (most

distinguished American picture book for children): *Watercress* illustrated by Jason Chin, written by Andrea Wang

Coretta Scott King Book Award (recognizing an African American author and illustrator of outstanding books for children and young adults): *Unspeakable: The Tulsa Race Massacre* written by Carole Boston Weatherford & illustrated by Floyd Cooper

Jane and the Year Without a Summer by Stephanie Barron

This is the 14th book in a series about author Jane Austen solving mysteries in the early 1800s. This book is set in 1816. Jane has traveled with her sister Cassandra to Cheltenham Spa in Gloucestershire, England. The sisters have rented rooms at Mrs. Potter's boarding house. All is well until wheelchair-bound Miss Williams arrives with her companion, Miss Fox.

Soon grumpy parson Garthwaite and his sister check in. One evening a gentleman friend of Jane's escorts the sisters to a musical performance where Miss Williams is shocked to see her husband. She is really Lady Portreath! A few days later a murder takes place.

The title of the book refers the real life eruption of Mount Tambora in the South Pacific in 1816, which caused climate change around the world for 16 months.

Author Barron does a good job of bringing historical facts into her fiction.
