Friday, March 20, 3:30pm

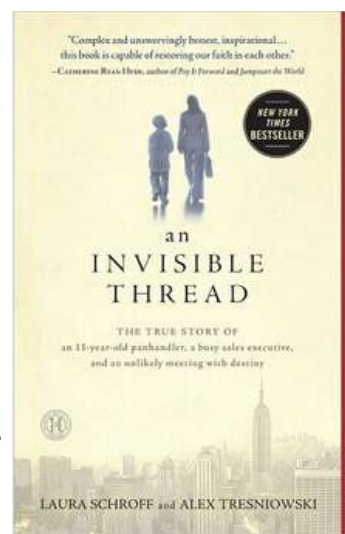
